Accomplishments

With the support of our member firms, ACEC/MA works to protect and promote your business. ACEC/MA's work with state leaders, legislators and with state agencies has led to the following recent victories:



1. Through partnership with MassHighway, MBTA and DCAM, the hourly rates and overhead caps have been raised and retainage has been eliminated on new MassHighway contracts.
2. Passage of the 'single designer' law, enabling engineering firms to do both preliminary and final designs on certain projects.
3. Passage of the 2006 Economic Stimulus Bill, creating a Goddard Commission on Science, Technology, Engineering and Math, with a reserved seat for the CEO of a consulting engineering firm.
4. Work to support the legislation that streamlines the environmental permitting and appeals process in the State.
5. Passage of language mandating a seat for an ACEC/MA representative on the Massachusetts School Building Authority Advisory Board and on the Designer Selection Board.
6. Support of opportunities in which the government can privatize parts of its work and consider alternative project delivery methods.
7. Support of Construction reform legislation.
8. Protect the interests of private sector engineers by supporting or opposing legislation that affects the industry.

ACEC/MA is active in increasing public awareness of the deteriorating condition of our infrastructure, and identifying the financial resources that it will take to maintain it, expand it and improve it. I whole heartedly support these efforts.




