- Lyme Disease Legislation still in committee, please contact your legislators: MALSCE, ACEC/MA and BSCES support two Lyme insurance bills, H. 901 and S. 502, "An Act Relative to Lyme Disease Treatment Coverage." More Information
- Governor's version of **FY2017 operating budget**was released on January 27, 2016. House Ways & Means is expected to issue its version of the budget in April, then Senate action, then conference committee, with a goal of completing the FY2017 budget before June 30, 2016.
- MassDOT 5-year Capital Improvement Plan is expected to be released in a few weeks.
- Governor's version of capital budget expected in June 2016.

Updates from Massachusetts
Board of Registration of
PEs and PLSs

From January-February 2016

At the February 2016 meeting, The Board discussed:

- Issues related to applicants' eligibility to sit for PE or PLS exam.
- What constitutes a failure of the 2-day Structural Exam.
- Issue of proving that a candidate has actually taken a course recommended by the board as needed to meet the education requirements:
- Issue of registering, under comity, a construction engineer licensed in another state.
- Request from MALSCE: Issue of course materials needed to prepare for the PLS exam.
 MALSCE has asked the Board to assist with a list of updated materials.

2016 ALTA/NSPS Standards - effective February 23, 2016

The Survey will be known as an ALTA/NSPS LAND TITLE SURVEY. The title has been revised to reflect the name: National Society of Professional Surveyors (NSPS), which is the legal successor organization to the American Congress on Surveying and Mapping (ACSM). All references to ALTA/ACSM Land Title Surveys must be changed to ALTA/NSPS Land Title Surveys.
