Please Participate in the National Geodetic Survey's GNSS Data Collection Project

The National Geodetic Survey (NGS) is actively improving the accuracy of its hybrid geoid model and will replace GEOID12B with GEOID18 in early 2019. This new hybrid geoid model will improve the derivation of orthometric heights (elevations) referenced to the North American Vertical Datum of 1988 (NAVD 88) using Global Navigation Satellite System (GNSS) technology. The new model will also thereafter serve as the official means for obtaining NAVD 88 heights via GNSS.

NGS will use GNSS data collected on bench marks to create the new hybrid geoid model. Recent analyses have revealed 25 areas in Massachusetts where the collection and submission of additional GNSS data will improve the geoid model by either confirming or updating the relationships between ellipsoid, orthometric, and geoid heights.

Interested MALSCE members are asked to participate in this project by occupying with GNSS one or more of the 25 identified bench marks and sharing the collected GNSS data with NGS.
