### Updates from MA Board of Registration of PEs and PLSs

The Massachusetts Board of Registration of PEs and PLSs met on October 29 and November 19. On October 29, the board discussed the draft regulations of the Board of Registration of Architects and determined that the online Land Surveying/Geomatics curriculum offered by Great Basin College in Elko, Nevada does satisfy the requirements of 250 CMR 3.02. On November 19, 2015, the Board announced several amendments to 250 CMR. Most of the proposed changes are to make some corrections and clarifications. The board is also investigating a claim that an out of state land surveying firm appears to have inappropriately copied a MA-licensed PLS's seal and signature to use on plans in western Massachusetts that were not prepared by the MA-licensed PLS.

NSPS's government affairs consultant firm, John M. Palatiello and Associates, Inc., monitors and reports on federal government activities of interest and concern to NSPS members. The consultant also works closely with the members of the NSPS Government Affairs Committee and executive director to represent the members' interests before Congress and the executive branch. One of the top NSPS legislative priorities, improved location data for pipelines, got a boost last week when Senators Deb Fischer (R-NE) and Cory Booker (D-NJ) introduced the "Securing America's Future Energy: Protecting our Infrastructure of Pipelines and Enhancing Safety Act" or the "SAFE PIPES Act"
