

2024 Francis M. Keville Memorial Scholarship Application

The Francis M. Keville Memorial Fund was established from donations in recognition of Mr. Keville's efforts and abilities to take his vision of large public transportation projects and make them a reality. The fund provides a forum to discuss important aspects of transportation and construction related matters through an annual function and is devoted to the encouragement of individual or groups in the following ways:

- Provides, through a competitive selection, a scholarship to students at local engineering colleges and universities in recognition of achievement or promise in transportation and/or construction.
- Provides a grant to a worthy activity enhancing the transportation and/or construction related field.

This merit-based scholarship is for the academic year beginning in the fall of 2024 and has a total value of \$10,000. This award may be used for tuition, books, housing, or other needs.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Francis M. Keville Memorial Scholarship, a student must:

- Be attending a Massachusetts college or university for at least one full academic year and accepted for admission or currently enrolled in an <u>ABET</u> accredited program for a bachelor's degree in civil engineering with a transportation or construction focus or a bachelor's degree in construction management.
- Have at least one full academic year remaining prior to completing their degree.
- Demonstrate a strong interest in pursuing a career in a transportation or construction discipline of civil engineering or construction management.
- Be a BSCES Student Member.

How to Apply

Assemble the application in the following order. Do not staple or use a report binder.

- 1. Student Scholarship Application Form (the application is a fillable form). An online version of this application is available <u>here</u>.
- 2. At least two, and no more than three, letters of recommendation. These letters should be one page long and addressed to the Francis M. Keville Scholarship.
 - a. One letter of recommendation must be from college/university faculty.
 - b. The second letter of recommendation may be from anyone you choose, such as a teacher or employer (excluding family members).
- 3. An essay, no more than 1,200 words, that describes your future and interest in a career in a transportation or construction discipline of civil engineering or construction management, and how your experience demonstrates achievement or promise in transportation and/or construction.
- 4. One copy of your official college or university transcript.

Your application must be postmarked no later than Friday, September 6, 2024, and mail with the above items to: Francis M. Keville Memorial Scholarship

Evaluation Criteria

Eligible scholarship applicants will be rated on the basis of grade point average, demonstrated commitment to a career in a transportation or construction discipline of civil engineering or construction management, demonstrated commitment to leadership and engagement both on-and off-campus, achievement or promise in transportation and/or construction, submitted essay, and letters of recommendation. Scholarship finalists will also be rated on the basis of an interview.

Members of BSCES's ASCE Construction Institute Boston Chapter will review applications for completion, rate each applicant, select and interview the finalists, and recommend a scholarship recipient for the BSCES Board of Government's consideration and approval. The 2024 Francis M. Keville Memorial Scholarship recipient will be recognized for their achievement during the BSCES Annual Awards Dinner in June.
